Women in Leeds who have experienced the death of an infant and are from groups at highest risk of this, have been interviewed as part of a University of Leeds research study, exploring the support they received during maternity and after birth. The women were also given an opportunity to be part of a Project Development Group, working on solutions to the barriers that the research highlighted. The group has been meeting regularly since November 2012 and collaborating with people involved in the delivery of health and social care services.
